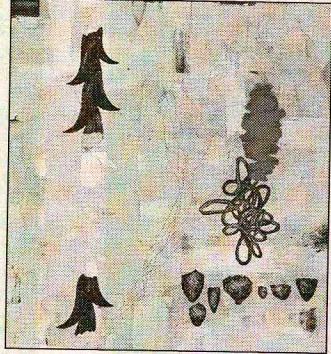

Visual arts In the abstract

In the wake of its annual art auction, San Jose's **Institute of Contemporary Art** is opening two exhibits for its fall/early winter season. First up is "Dos Mundos: Painting and Works on Paper," a show dedicated to the work of Northern California abstract artist Tim Craighead. His dreamlike pieces are populated with repetitive symbols and shapes and often mix the recognizable with the mysterious. It will open Saturday and run through Feb. 18. On Nov. 12, the institute opens "One Thing Leads to Another," which highlights pieces created by artists-in-residence at the Institute of Contemporary Art Print Center. In particular, the exhibition will examine the use of process and repetition in art. The show will run through Feb. 25. An opening reception for both exhibits is planned for 6 to 8 p.m. Nov. 11 at the institute, 560 S. First St. Hours are 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Friday and noon to 5 p.m. Saturday.
